

If you don't know your evacuation zone, Pinellas County Emergency Management has all the tools that you'll need to find out. Visit their website, at PinellasCounty.org/emergency and click on "Know Your Zone."

Once you know your evacuation zone, you'll want to complete your disaster plan don't forget to plan for medications, pets, and special needs accommodations. You'll want to make sure to have your important documents in one location and ready to take with you in the case of evacuation.

Mayor's Award of Excellence

The Mayor's Award of Excellence recognizes the efforts of residents and business owners to beautify Safety Harbor through landscaping and renovation projects. On February 20, 2017, Mayor Steingold presented Jenna Wylie and Jihlah Steele with the Mayor's Award of Excellence.

Over the past year and a half, they transformed the façade and front yard of their two-story home at 325 5th Avenue North. The home was originally constructed in 1910. Exterior renovations included a front porch and room addition, the reframing of windows and trimming, and refacing of the facade. New outdoor elements included landscaping, a paved outdoor space and fire pit, and a brick driveway leading to 5th Avenue North. Two downtown partnership grants were approved for the project in 2015 and 2016 for landscaping and façade improvements.

Help Keep Tampa Bay Clean


Despite environmental regulations that protect the quality of streams, lakes, and wetlands, solid waste in the form of trash, litter, and garbage often ends up in these surface waters. Because surface waters collect in low-lying areas, anything that is dropped or blown into a watershed can eventually reach a drainageway.

In urban areas, trash and litter (general terms for dry solid waste) often are transported by stormwater runoff. When we see the catch basins (storm drains) in our street, we know that rain water empties into them. The stormwater pipes under our streets connect all of the rain water from our storm drains and transport the stormwater directly to Tampa Bay. There is no treatment plant that removes trash, fertilizers, or solids from the water before it goes into the Bay.

In an effort to help with water quality for Tampa Bay, we are asking our residents not to place trash, yard waste, or recycle containers on top of catch basins to prevent trash from the cans falling on the ground and ending up in the storm pipe clogging them or going directly into the Bay. It's a nice flat place to put the containers, but please help our sanitation department to reduce the chance of any trash getting into the storm drains.

Tree News

This year has been exciting for tree planting. One project is the beautiful grounds of Espiritu Santo Catholic Church. Father Len Piotrowski has led a massive tree planting project effort on the property in the past year. The church has planted over a 200 trees. Live oaks, Jacarandas, elms, red cedars - you name it they have planted it. They have also landscaped many areas with colorful blooming plants. It's like walking in a botanical garden.



The next project is Folly Farms Park. There is a beautiful oak hammock with a red maple tree swamp on this gorgeous piece of property donated by Mr. Weiss. This is also the site of the city's community garden. Around the garden over 100 fruit-bearing trees have been planted. The trees have informational plaques, and if they have fruit, you are welcome to eat it. Another 61 additional flowering and shade trees were planted around the property. Arbor Day was celebrated April 22 at Folly Farms with the planting of a mango tree. The next large tree planting is at the Waterfront Park where boardwalks have been built out into Tampa Bay. The exotic invasive Brazilian peppers trees have been removed, and in their place, volunteers planted over 1,800 mangrove trees in the wetlands. In the uplands, 56 trees have been planted which are red cedars, magnolias, slash pine, live oaks, hickories, and Sabal palm trees.



Another interesting fact about Safety Harbor is that we are the only city with named centennial trees. We have the Baranoff Oak, Elf Oak, Lovers Oak, and the newly named tree, called the Pipkin Oak, which is located behind the library. The three massive oaks by the library have lightning protection since lightning is the main killer of big trees. The city offers free inspection of your trees.
