Get your Play on!

The second construction phase of Waterfront Park is complete and was opened to the public on May 5, 2017. It features 2,000 feet of boardwalk that includes scenic outlooks to Tampa Bay and a bridge crossing of Mullet Creek. There are four trailheads with bench seating, bike racks, and one with a bicycle tool station. Sixteen grass parking spaces are available at the Jefferson Street at North Bayshore Drive park entrance. A water fountain is provided at the trail head adjacent to the grass parking. Two acres of wetlands were created that will, in a few years, develop into a mangrove habita

Grand Opening was held on June 16, 2017, to officially open the park.



Watering Restrictions

Due to the current drought conditions, the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) issued a modified Phase III Water Shortage Order that includes Pinellas County. The order went into effect on June 5, 2017 and requests that all water users reduce wasteful and unnecessary water use and be prepared for more stringent restrictions if drought conditions worsen.

Customers should monitor Pinellas County Utilities' water restrictions website at pinellascounty.org/utilities/water-restrict.htm for up-to-date information; restrictions can change at any time. Unless your city or county already has stricter hours in effect, the allowable watering hours are before 8 a.m. or after 6 p.m., regardless of property size. To find your watering days, visit pinellascounty.org/utilities/water-restrict.htm.

Customers using reclaimed water provided by Pinellas County Utilities should be following the reclaimed water restrictions found at pinellascounty.org/utilities/reclaim-irrigation.htm.



Trash and Recycling Reminders

By following these simple instructions below, you can help make curbside collection successful, which will prevent missed collection.

1. Please place your garbage/recycling container three feet away from all trees, mailboxes, other trash containers, parked cars, utility poles or anything else that could get in the way of the automated arm.

2. Place the container within two feet of the curb, with the lid closed and the arrow marked on the lid, pointed towards the street by 6:30 A.M. on your regular collection day. Remember it is very important the lid closes to prevent things from spilling out during collection.

3. Yard waste will be collected on Wednesday in your 32-gallon cans or bundled at the curb.

Ready Pinellas: Emergency Planning Mobile App

Ready Pinellas was designed to help residents prepare themselves and their families before a storm and as a storm approaches. It is available for free download on the Apple App Store and Google Play.

Ready Pinellas App features: Know Your Zone, readiness checklists, Get a Plan (develops a personalized emergency plan), Alert Pinellas, Storm Surge Protector, special needs registration, pet preparedness.

Fertilizer Ban

from Pinellas County Environmental

- **June 1 - September 30:** Skip the fertilizer during the summer rainy season.
- **Near waterfront:** Keep a 10 ft. buffer fertilizer free zone.
- **Landscape maintenance:** Blow grass clippings, sand and leaves back in the yard.
- **Irrigation:** Reclaimed water is liquid nutrients, conserve water and skip the fertilizer.

Incorrect use of fertilizer and poor landscape debris management can allow nutrients to leach into the groundwater and wash into storm drains that flow to creeks, lakes, Tampa Bay, or the Gulf of Mexico.

Excess nutrients can cause harmful algae blooms which lower oxygen levels and lead to fish kills. The treatment to remove these nutrients cost taxpayers millions of dollars each year. Nutrient pollutions can be controlled with your help. An ounce of prevention is worth a ton of cure!
