Downtown Partnership Grants Available

The City of Safety Harbor Community Redevelopment Agency provides economic incentives encouraged by the Downtown Master Plan. Grant funding is available this fall for projects within the Community Redevelopment District. The application deadline is October 16, 2017. Applications are reviewed prior to the commencement of the project, and approved grant reimbursements are issued after the work is complete. Neighborhood Grant Opportunities

Does your neighborhood association or organization have ideas to beautify or enhance a common area? Neighborhood project and beautification matching grant applications are being accepted this fall. The application deadline is October 2, 2017. Eligible projects for neighborhood project grants include physical improvements including entryway signs, fencing, walkways, fountains, and lighting. PENNY FOR PINELLAS REFERENDUM VOTE NOVEMBER 7, 2017

On Nov. 7, 2017, Pinellas County residents will decide on the renewal of the Penny for 10 years (2020-2030). The Penny makes it possible to do more capital projects without relying on property taxes. The Penny generates the equivalent of 2.4 mills of property taxes (\$314 on the average single-family home with a taxable value of \$131,000). Without the Penny, Safety Harbor would rely more heavily on other funding sources, such as property taxes, to fund capital projects. Without such funding, many projects would be delayed or deleted.

Water Main Replacement Project

Water main improvements in the area south of City Hall will begin in August 2017. The work is necessary to replace aging infrastructure. Approximately 4,300 feet of 6 inch water main and 4,100 feet of 2 inch water main will be installed. Where possible, water lines will be installed by directional drill in order to minimize impacts to trees, sidewalks, driveways, roadways, and other infrastructure. The process consists of drilling a path at the desired location and depth, then pulling the water main into place. The contractor will coordinate with residents to assure access to their property and minimal disturbance to their water service.

Library Collecting Items for Centennial Time Capsule

The Safety Harbor Public Library is inviting community groups, service organizations, schools, businesses, and residents to contribute items for consideration for placement in a centennial time capsule. The Library is seeking ideas for objects reflecting Safety Harbor's community and contemporary daily life and has outlined some guidelines to ensure items have the best chance to remain intact when the capsule is opened in 50 years. Items proposed will be evaluated for inclusion in the time capsule. To suggest an item, please complete the short form located on the rotator on the Library homepage. Selected items will be collected in early November, inventoried, and stored away for their five decade rest at the Library.

Items to avoid because of their tendency to decompose include: pressure sensitive adhesives, such as masking tape, electronics, newspapers, audio or compact discs, silk, wool, nylon, or rubber. Suggestions include: brochures, calendars, maps, local magazines, menus, meeting agendas, newsletters, old and current photo comparisons of buildings or locations, a photo of current City Commission, centennial pins, specialty items from your business or service organization, aerial photos of the city, etc. The Library will offer journals at City facilities for community members to write or draw in to be placed in the time capsule.

Contents of a time capsule from 1987 will be shared at the October 16, Commission meeting where a letter written 30 years ago to the current commission will be opened by officials. For more information, please contact the library at shplref@cityofsafetyharbor.com.

Wednesday Yard Waste Pickup

On Wednesdays, the Sanitation Division picks up yard waste for city residents. All yard waste collected is taken to the Pinellas County Landfill where it is recycled for mulch. In order for the yard waste to be recycled into mulch, it must be free of any contamination. Contamination means anything that is not pure vegetation.



Yard waste materials, such as grass clippings and leaves, must be placed in unlined garbage cans no larger than 32 gallons, limited to 1.5 cubic yards in volume (1.5 cubic yards is equal to 8 cans or bundles), and curbside by 6:30 am on Wednesday only.

Yard waste too bulky to be containerized, such as branches and other vegetative materials, must be cut into sections no longer than 4 feet in length and 6 inches in diameter, then bundled with twine in arm size manageable bundles. Please do not tape bundles or mix paper or plastic in since this will contaminate the recycling process and will result in yard waste not being collected. Piles of yard waste in excess of 1.5 cubic yards will be left at the curb. Residents can call in and request special arrangement with the Sanitation Division for additional cost. *Garbage collection will happen as usual.

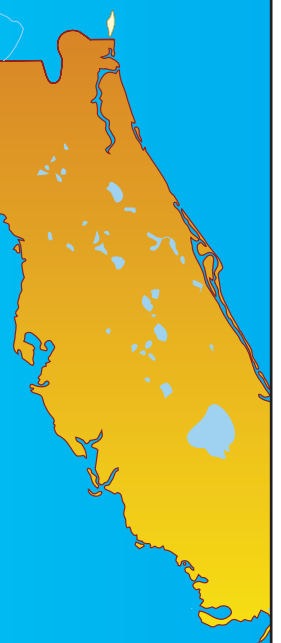
Community Center will be closed Saturday, September 2.
