## *Effects of Hurricane Irma on Safety Harbor's Tree Canopy*

On September 10, Hurricane Irma rolled through our area. In my opinion, the storm was nature pruning the trees of poorly attached branches, thinning the canopy, removing diseased trees, removing weak wooded tropical and exotic invasive trees that were improperly pruned in the past. The city's tree canopy was largely left intact because of the majority of high-wind resistant live oak trees.

The City lost power during the storm from downed power lines caused mainly from the failure of chinaberry trees and other weak wooded tropical trees. Please, remove or trim these trees that target powerlines and homes. These trees do not require a tree removal permit.

We also learned that trees that were improperly pruned had many branch failures, and in some cases, caused tree failure. When pruning your trees, retain the trees' lower branches and most of the branch sprouts in the tree canopy for high wind resistance. Branch sprouts thicken the main branches, and when a branch gets too long, there is a branch to cut back too.

Do not remove diseased trees and trim away large deadwood and branches with decay over the roof. Trees do not need a lot of trimming. Have a certified arborist check your trees to see if you need a permit for removal. The city arborist will come out for free for a tree inspection. ## *Walkability Audits Result in Pedestrian Improvements*

At their goal setting session on March 30, 2017, the City Commission approved a walkability audit pilot project and entered into a contract with Forward Pinellas to lead the audit. Twenty five people, including residents, City Commissioners, Planning and Zoning Board members, and staff from several agencies participated. A training was held on Thursday, October 12, and the audit and summary session were held on Sunday, October 15. One group walked from Marshall Street Park to City Hall and one group walked from the intersection of SR 590 and McMullen Booth Road to City Hall. Along the walk, participants noted pedestrian facilities that worked well or needed improvement.



Forward Pinellas staff presented the summary report to the City Commission on November 20, 2017. A link is below:

The City Commission discussed a draft list of pedestrian and parking signage improvements on February 5, 2018. Several improvements were completed or are scheduled to be complete this year, including:

- Enhanced public downtown parking signage and new downtown parking web page
- Sidewalk repairs in numerous locations
- New sidewalk on 10th Ave. S.
- Shade tree planting on 9th Avenue N.
- Restriping and striping of stop bars north and south of Main Street
- Bicycling and walking route maps

Staff has also been coordinating with other jurisdictions that maintain streets within Safety Harbor regarding pedestrian facility improvements. As a result of these discussions, high visibility pedestrian crosswalks are being installed by Pinellas County on Enterprise Road near the entrance to Harbor Woods and by the City of Clearwater on S. Bayshore Drive south of the Alligator Lake bridge.

Safety Harbor was the first community to conduct a walkability audit with Forward Pinellas and other cities in Pinellas County are scheduling audits. The City wishes to thank Forward Pinellas staff for their expertise and assistance with the walkability audit, which resulted in numerous improvements and provided a valuable tool for the community to evaluate pedestrian facilities.

## ***Recycling Update***

The way the City of Safety Harbor's Public Works Department handles the recyclables that it collects from Safety Harbor residents will change temporarily. Services and collection days will not be affected and residents are encouraged to continue recycling efforts. Safety Harbor partners with the City of Clearwater and utilizes Clearwater's transfer station for disposal of recyclable materials. There was a fire at the Tampa Bay facility that the City of Clearwater sends its collected recyclables to for processing. Damages at the facility were extensive, and it cannot receive recycled materials for four to six weeks.

As alternative recovery facilities are sought to process recyclables, it is possible that Public Works may have to send city recyclables to the Pinellas Waste-to-Energy Plant. While recycling is always the city's preferred method of waste processing, sending waste to be used in the county's Waste-to-Energy Plant is another beneficial option—as the plant burns 90 percent of its waste received in order to provide power to 40,000 local homes each day. The plant also recovers all aluminum and metal from burned waste, sending these materials to be recycled. Recyclables will be sent back to the Tampa Bay processing facility as soon as it resumes normal operations.

## Help clean-up Safety Harbor's curbside recycling problem.



Once a week, the City collects recycling for City residents and businesses. Our goal is to keep recycling easy for the residents in order to keep increasing participation levels, keep the contamination level low, and prevent hauling to the landfill.

These are the things you can do to help prevent contamination in your recycling containers:

1. Do not place any plastic grocery style bags or "tangles" in the recycling.
2. Look for recycling labels on packaging to help identify whether it is recyclable or not.
3. Empty and rinse all containers.
4. Don't forget to recycle items from all rooms in the house - e.g. shampoo bottles from the bathroom.
5. If in doubt, check the City website or call Public Works before disposing of any goods in the recycling container.

Improper recycling can cause accident or injuries to our employees along with possible processing delays, hazardous working conditions, and damage to the processing facility. Let's do our best to help keep Safety Harbor beautiful and our recycling contaminate free.
