Summer Time Recycling Tips:

It's vacation season, and whether you're heading out of town or just down to the beach, here are a few tips to you keep you green while you're on the go.

1. Bring Snacks and Water in Reusable Containers

Food and drinks account for a lot of single-use packaging. By bringing your snacks and drinks in reusable containers, you can reduce much of that waste.

2. Bring Bags to Collect Recyclables

When you're out and about, you might not always have an option to recycle, so bring a bag with you that you can stash your recyclables in until you can put them in your curbside toter at home. Want



to show your Safety Harbor spirit? You can come by City Hall and pick up your own Safety Harbor Recycles re-usable bag to keep around for transporting your recyclables.

3. Skip the Straw

Americans use over 500 million plastic straws every day! Straws don't biodegrade and cannot be recycled, many plastic straws make their way into the water and threaten our marine neighbors. If you just can't bear to skip the straw, you can get re-usable straws from most retailers, or stop by City Hall or a Safety Harbor Recreation center to pick up a free re-usable straw.

You may have Netflix, but Hoopla is free with your library card, with access to thousands of movies, TV shows, music, audiobooks, eBooks, and comic books.

2. Digital Magazines and Audio Books

RB Digital provides access to thousands of audiobooks and over 150 popular digital magazines you can read anywhere with no due dates or waiting lists. Perfect to take with you on your summer vacation.

3. Free Museum Passes

Planning a staycation? Thanks to partnerships with six local museums, the library offers free family admissions. Checkout our museum passes available on a first come, first serve basis.

4. Borrow Tools

Planning a summer DIY project? Check out the tool library before you buy one from Home Depot. From miter and tile saws, to drills, pressure washers and garden tools, we may have what you need.

5. Home Delivery

Are you unable to get to the library or know a resident who can't due to illness, disability, or injury? Our outreach librarian can suggest books, DVDs, and magazines, and deliver and pick up from your home.

6. Exploring Family History through Ancestry

Researching your family tree? Access Ancestry.com inside the library with your own laptop or one of our computers. Download census records, immigration information, passenger lists, birth, marriage, death, and military records.

7. A Place to Hang Out

You don't have to buy a cup of coffee to hang out here and use our Wi-Fi. Find a comfortable chair for yourself or reserve a study room for a small group meeting.

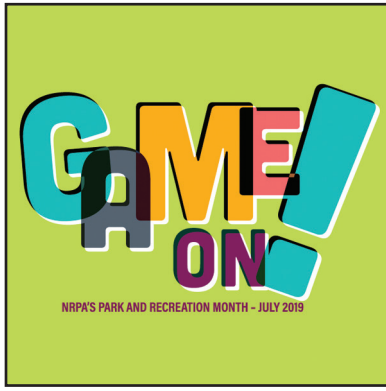
8. Borrow Books

Wednesday Yard Waste Pickup

On Wednesdays, the Sanitation Division picks up yard waste for City residents. All yard waste collected is taken to the Pinellas County Landfill where it is recycled for mulch. In order for the yard waste to be recycled into mulch, it must be free of any contamination. Contamination means anything that is not pure vegetation.

Yard waste materials, such as grass clippings and leaves, must be placed in unlined garbage cans, no larger than 32 gallons, and curbside by 6:30AM on Wednesdays only.

Yard waste too bulky to be containerized, such as branches and other vegetative materials, must be cut into sections no longer than four feet in length and six inches in diameter, then bundled with twine in arm-sized manageable bundles. Please do not tape bundles or mix paper or plastic in because this will contaminate the recycling process and will result in yard waste not being collected. For excessive piles larger than five feet by five feet, please call in and request special collection with the Sanitation Division by calling 724-1550, ext 2002.

If you have any further questions about yard waste collections, please call the Public Works Department at 724-1550 between 7:00AM and 3:30PM.
