It's that time of year again! To help celebrate Arbor Day here in Safety Harbor we are giving away hundreds of free trees to our residents on Saturday, October 19! Residents can receive up to two trees per household from 8:00 am to 11:00 am (or when trees run out) at the Public Works Complex at 1200 Railroad Ave. I'd suggest arriving early as cars were lined up at 7:30 am last year!

Varieties that will be available include flowering crepe myrtle, bottlebrush, tabebuia and cassia, as well as shade trees that include live oak, bald cypress, red cedar, magnolia, slash pine, winged elm and red maple.

Another program available to residents to help Safety Harbor keep our healthy tree canopy is the Street Tree Program. Applications will be accepted in January and February of 2020. And don't forget to participate in the Mayor's Tree Plant Challenge. Just take a picture with a tree you planted and e-mail it to MayorsTreeChallenge@CityofSafetyHarbor.com to enter. Children are especially encouraged to participate. Winners will be announced later in the year. Remember, the best time to plant a tree was 50 years ago, the next best time is today!

Capital Improvement Projects Update

Community Center Fitness Room

Construction continues on the new Fitness Room at the Community Center. Improvements to the lobby area are complete. The floor and walls of the Fitness Room are installed and the roof is currently being worked on. Construction is scheduled to be complete in September 2019. Once complete the City will install exercise equipment.

North Bayshore Gravity Sewer and Force Main

Installation of a 6-inch force main on Church Street and gravity sanitary sewer and manholes on North Bayshore Drive is complete. Installation of sanitary sewer lateral connections to homes along North Bayshore Drive remains to be done. Once the laterals are connected, disturbed areas will be restored and North Bayshore Drive pavement will be resurfaced. Work is scheduled to be complete by December 2019.



Baranoff Oak Park

On March 1, 2019, the City purchased the vacant parcel located on the northeast corner of Main Street and 2ND Avenue North. The parcel will be transformed into a passive park with various amenities such as a water fountain, picnic tables, bench swings, public art, a dog waste station, and porous walkways. Brick columns with lighting and metal fencing will be extended on 2ND Avenue North and Main Street from the Baranoff Oak. City staff will perform most of the work with collaboration between Public Works and Parks Department. The Engineering Department will be responsible for project management. Construction commenced June 18, 2019 and is scheduled to be completed by the end of September 2019.

Espiritu Santo Springs and Washington Brennan Subdivisions Water Main Replacement Project

Construction plans are complete for water main replacements on Philippe Parkway, Virginia Avenue, North Bayshore Drive, Church Street, Tucker Street, Hillsborough Street, Hamilton Avenue, Washington Drive, Conant Avenue and Jesse Avenue. The project is scheduled to go out to bid in September and the construction contract approved in October 2019 with construction to follow.

Green Springs Water Main Replacement

New water lines have been installed on North Bayshore, Jefferson Street, Philippe Parkway and on the eastern end of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK) Boulevard. Water main has been installed on 3RD Avenue North from 3RD Street North to MLK Boulevard, and on 5TH Avenue North from MLK Boulevard to north of 5TH Street North. Work remains to be done on the southern portions of 3RD and 5TH Avenue South, and on 3RD Street North. Work is scheduled to be complete in November 2019.
