

City of Safety Harbor Annual Governmental Fund Budget by June Solanes, Finance Director

The City's operating millage rate for fiscal year 2020 is 3.9500 mills. The millage rate has remained the same for the past four years. Your taxes may be slightly higher as overall property values in the City increased by 5.3 percent.

Your property tax bill contains more than just City taxes. You also pay property tax to the Pinellas County Board of Commissioners, Emergency Management Services, Pinellas Planning Council, Juvenile Welfare Board, School Board, Southwest Florida Water Management District and the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority. Your Safety Harbor City taxes make up twenty-one cents of every dollar of your total property tax bill.

Where the Money Comes From

For financial reporting the City maintains 15 individual governmental funds. Governmental funds are primarily supported by tax dollars and are used to account for the City's basic services provided, including general government, public safety, transportation, physical environment, culture and recreation, debt service and transfers. The majority of services provided are supported through property tax, utility tax, franchise fees, state shared taxes and direct services revenues. Municipal property tax collections make up 29.0 percent of the total governmental fund revenues. Fiscal year 2020 marks the seventh consecutive year of real property taxable value increases in Safety Harbor.



Where the Money Goes To

Total City governmental fund expenditures of \$21.5 million decreased by 13.1 percent from estimated fiscal year end 2019. Library, Parks and Recreation, Transportation Improvements and Public Safety continue to be high priorities within the community. Over the last 10 years, the City has maintained or increased levels of service. Since 2009, five new parks have been added including Elm Street Property recreation open space, Mullet Creek Park, Waterfront

Park, Folly Farms Nature Preserve and Baranoff Park. During this same period recreation program participation increased by 51.6 percent and in 2012 the city began operating the Safety Harbor Museum and Cultural Center. In 2020, Community Center and Folly Farm Nature Preserve improvements will be completed. Library cardholders have increased 34.8 percent since 2009. In the current year, engineering and architectural design services are programmed for the Library second story meeting room build-out. Since 2010, the Building Department has recognized a 112.6 percent increase in building permits issued and a 118.7 percent increase in inspections performed. LEARN: Traveling this year? Learn a new language with *Pronunciator*, an online resource to help build conversational skills using interactive lessons. GENEALOGY RESEARCH: Research your family history, with *Ancestry*, available inside the Library. Locate census data, immigration information, passenger lists, birth, marriage, death, and military records, plus tools to create family tree records.

HEALTH: Resolutions to exercise and eat better? Check our DVDs on yoga or weight training. Find a cookbook or magazine packed with healthy recipes. Walk or bike to the library, burning calories and saving fuel. Download the free Florida Stories app and stroll the streets while listening to the colorful history of Safety Harbor. Meet new friends by attending one of our three monthly book clubs.

START YOUR SMALL BUSINESS: Use small business resources such as *AtoZDatabases* for marketing plans or schedule a counseling session with a SCORE representative to get your specific questions answered.

FREE MUSEUM PASSES: Thanks to partnerships with local eight museums, including the Museum of Fine Arts in St. Petersburg, the Library along with Pinellas Public Library Cooperative, offers free family admission with the checkout of a museum pass.

EXPAND YOUR HORIZONS: Attend our free educational and cultural programs for adults, teens, and children. Be one of the 26,066 guests that attended our programs last year! There is something for everyone from story time to concerts.

GET YOUR HS DIPLOMA: Through Career Online High School, the library offers a limited number of free scholarships to qualified adult learners (19+), looking to advance their careers, prepare for workforce entry, and continue their education.

Tree News

Arbor Day

At their meeting on October 7, 2019, the City Commission proclaimed October 19, 2019 as Arbor Day. To commemorate Arbor Day, a tree giveaway was held on October 23, 2019 at the Public Works compound. Over 500 flowering and shade trees were given away. In addition, a tree planting was held at Safety Harbor Middle School on November 13, 2019. Students planted two live oak trees with Mayor Ayoub. Art Finn, City Arborist, organized both events.



Street Tree Program 2020

The City of Safety Harbor has a street tree planting program where shade trees are planted on residential front yards, at the request of residents. All requests will be reviewed to confirm the tree can thrive in the requested location and there are no utility conflicts.

The next deadline to apply is February 14, 2020. A waiver is required at time of application. Available trees include Southern Live Oak, Shumard Oak, Bluff Oak, Sand Live Oak, Bald Cypress, Pignut Hickory, and Winged Elms. Applicants are responsible for watering the trees.
