Mayor's Award of Excellence

At the October 19, 2020 City Commission, Mayor Ayoub presented Dr. Edward Deutscher with a "Mayor's Award of Excellence for Beautifying Safety Harbor" plaque for recent enhancements at Tonicity Health and Wellness, located at 324 Main Street. This space was completely transformed through interior and exterior renovations from an empty restaurant to a medi-spa use. Renovations included new plumbing, electrical, framing, insulation, HVAC system, windows, doors, and floors in the interior of the building and lighting, parking, painting, and signage on the exterior of the building.

At the November 16, 2020 City Commission meeting, the Mayor presented Kent Runnels with a "Mayor's Award of Excellence for Beautifying Safety Harbor" plaque for recent enhancements to the Café Vino Tinto located at 509 Main Street. The two-story building was constructed in 1920 and has had several uses over time. The last use was an art cooperative, and for over fifteen years, this building sat empty. The owners of Café Vino Tinto (Kent and Logan Runnels) transformed the first floor through interior and exterior renovations. In addition, they added a covered outdoor seating and ordering area. This renovation activated a very important portion of Main Street.

The Mayor's Award of Excellence recognizes efforts by residents and businesses to beautify Safety Harbor through landscaping and renovation projects.

What's a Firefighter's Day Like? by: Josh Stefancic, Fire Chief

The Safety Harbor Fire Department is staffed by 27 firefighters. This includes three District Chiefs, six Captains, two Firefighter/EMTs, and 16 Firefighter/Paramedics. All personnel are assigned to working one of the department's three shifts. Each shift is 24 hours long and starts at 8:00 AM each day. Each firefighter will work one 24-hour shift, and then have 48 hours off before coming back again. During the day, our firefighters ensure our fire trucks are maintained and ready to respond to calls, maintain our fire stations, complete training, work on special projects, and of course, respond to 911 calls around the clock. In the last 12 months, the Safety Harbor Fire Department responded to 4,130 emergency incidents - just over 11 per day.

The City of Safety Harbor is continuing the Annual Street Tree Program. City residents can sign up to have a free shade tree planted in their front yards. All requests will be reviewed to ensure the selected tree is appropriate for the requested location and will not conflict with utilities.

Available trees include Southern Live Oak, Sand Live Oak, Bald Cypress, Pignut Hickory, and Winged Elm. The trees will be planted by the City; however, applicants are responsible for watering the trees during the establishment period. A tree watering schedule will be provided to each applicant.

Pinellas County Flood Plain Update

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is updating the Pinellas County digital Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM), including the maps within the City of Safety Harbor. These maps are based on revised coastal flood modeling and may affect owners of properties susceptible to flooding from the Gulf, Tampa Bay, and inland areas near waterways connected to the Gulf or Bay. In 2021, FEMA will issue Letters of Final Determination (LFDs) making the flood hazard information final. The City of Safety Harbor will then adopt the revised FIRMs and update the floodplain management ordinances. The updated flood hazard information will go into effect six months after the LFDs are issued.
