Only regular garbage can be placed in your trash can or dumpster. Household chemicals are not allowed to be placed in your trash can or in the dumpsters at multi-family units or businesses. Common cleaning products and other chemicals can seem innocent, but when combined with other items, they can be explosive.

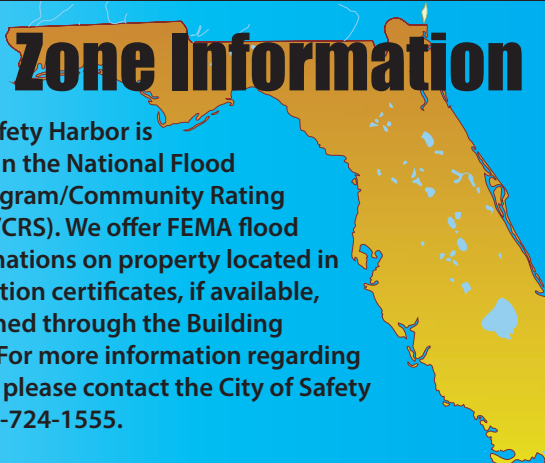
