BILL CROPSEY CITIZEN'S ACADEMY 2022 *by: Kim Nicholls, Human Resources Director*

The City of Safety Harbor is now accepting applications for the 2022 - Bill Cropsey Citizen's Academy. Sessions are scheduled on Tuesday evenings (from 6:00p.m. to 8:00 p.m.) and will begin on April 19, 2022 (some live sessions/some via Microsoft Teams). The Bill Cropsey Citizen's Academy takes place over a seven-week period and will be limited to 25 participants. Academy applicants will be chosen on a first come, first served basis with preference given to Safety Harbor residents.

The Bill Cropsey Citizen's Academy will tour key facilities, learn about the challenges facing Safety Harbor, interact with City leaders, discover ways to get involved with local government, and learn about the essential functions of a municipal government agency.

STREET TREE PROGRAM 2022 *by: Ira Padgett, City Arborist*

The City of Safety Harbor is continuing the Annual Street Tree Program. City residents can sign up to have a free shade tree planted in their front yards. All requests will be reviewed to ensure the selected tree is appropriate for the requested location and will not conflict with utilities.

Available trees include: Southern Live Oak, Eastern Red Cedar, Bald Cypress, and Winged Elm. The trees will be planted by the City; however, applicants are responsible for watering the trees during the establishment period. A tree watering schedule will be provided to each applicant.



AROUND SAFETY HARBOR

DEVELOPING FIRE ESCAPE PLANS *by: Andrew Portale, Firefighter/Paramedic*



The adage “failing to plan is a plan to fail” is a sobering reality if your household is unprepared for emergencies. Your Safety Harbor Firefighters would like to offer a few basic principles to arm your family with a new fire drill plan to kick off the new year. Begin by ensuring everyone above a reasonable age can dial 9-1-1 and provide the emergency dispatcher with your home address. Confirm your address numerical is visible on the house, mailbox, or curb so first responders can quickly locate your residence.

Now that you have facilitated a timely emergency response, it's time to develop your fire escape plan. We recommend sitting down with family members or roommates to create a map of the house that includes doors, windows, and each level, if applicable. Your plan should describe a primary and secondary exit from each room. Encourage children to

respond to activated fire alarms and test doors with the back of their hand, emphasizing a hot door is not a viable escape route. This drill is an opportunity to observe your kids maneuver windows and screens to escape without adults' help. The final step is to agree upon a meeting place in the front of your home where emergency crews can easily account for all occupants.

Practice your fire escape plan twice a year and encourage expedient egress. Remember, when the fire alarm sounds get low, go, and stay out; never return inside for people, pets, or things.

WEATHERSTEM STATIONS IN SAFETY HARBOR *by: Paul Cales, Information Technology Manager*

Did you know the City is now home to two WeatherSTEM stations that have live video and feature detailed weather information that updates in real-time? One is located at the Safety Harbor Marina and the other is at Fire Station 53.



You can view the weather stations online by visiting cityofsafetyharbor.com and clicking the “Connect” tab at the top of page or by downloading the WeatherSTEM app. You can find the app by searching “WeatherSTEM” in your app store.

Be sure to click around the WeatherSTEM site to check out the many links that provide additional information like “What phase is the moon in?” Clicking “Sun/Moon/Planets” will show you under “Lunar Info.”

If you're not a weather junkie and have no idea what all this means, WeatherSTEM has you covered. At the top of the page is a “Free Educational Content” link with loads of information.

Safety Harbor Public Library offers free scholarships to adult residents of Pinellas County for the opportunity to earn an accredited private high school diploma online along with a certificate in their chosen career path. The program is designed to re-engage students in the educational system and prepare them for the workplace or postsecondary education. Paths include childcare, office management, retail customer service, food service, hospitality, general career preparation and more. To date, the Library graduated 20 students from this successful program. We encourage you to share this opportunity with friends and family who need a diploma.

Through a partnership with Career Online High School (COHS) and the Florida State Division of Library and Information Services, qualified students earn a high school diploma and a career certificate fully online. The program provides a 24/7 online classroom, personal academic coaches, and real-world career training. Previous high school credits may transfer.

“Libraries offer a safe, supportive environment to foster learning and community. Our online education program for adults is a natural extension of library services that empower adults to learn and grow,” said District Superintendent Dr. Howard Liebman. “COHS students receive support from Safety Harbor Public Library staff as well as from our academic coaches. Together, they help students achieve their goals.”




