HURRICANE & STORM PREP... IT'S NOT TOO LATE!

Now is the time to prepare your home for regular summer thunderstorms, tropical storms, and yes, even hurricanes. Here's an easy checklist to get you started.

- Check your doors, windows, and walls for areas where water could infiltrate. Re-caulk around doors and windows. Seal any openings where pipes or cables enter through exterior walls.
- Trim trees and shrubs back away from exterior walls and away from the roof line. Complete regular pruning of trees (consult the City Arborist or a Certified Arborist with any questions regarding correct pruning of trees).
- The heaviest leaf fall of the season is now over. Clean out gutters to prevent water from flooding the roof causing roof damage and potential roof leaks.
- Clear away any unnecessary yard clutter. Unsecured lawn furniture, toys, plants, etc., can become projectiles during a storm. Clearing now will save time during storm preparation later.

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AROUND SAFETY HARBOR

STOP, DROP, AND ROLL *by: Andrew Portale, Firefighter/Paramedic*

As we begin this summer season, there is no better time to fall back on the basics of fire safety, specifically Stop, Drop, and Roll. Now is a great moment to remind children to avoid sources of fire such as lighters, matches, and grills. In addition to unintended structure or wildfires, children may unintentionally catch clothing or hair on fire. Stop, drop, and roll is an easy, life-saving technique kids (and adults) of all ages can comprehend to minimize risk and expedite help.

Let's review the steps. First, we stop where we are to avoid fire spread. Next, we drop to the ground and protect our eyes and mouth with our hands to mitigate further injury. While on the ground, we should roll back and forth until the flames are completely out. When safe to do so, children should notify an adult and seek medical help by dialing 911. Bystanders can improve efforts by deploying a fire extinguisher, dousing the patient with water, or smothering the fire with a blanket.

Now that we have reviewed this timeless fire safety practice, let's discuss when stop, drop, and roll is not appropriate. Children should not perform these steps if they have an isolated burn, hear the smoke alarm, or observe a structure fire. Instead, seek out an adult and immediately notify your Safety Harbor Fire Rescue personnel.



STORM DRAIN MURAL PROGRAM *by: Renee Cooper, Public Works Director*

The City of Safety Harbor is excited to present our Storm Drain Mural Program. We welcome our residents, students, artists, and civic groups to apply to paint their own storm drain mural. In addition to their artistic value, painted storm drains will serve a very important educational purpose by addressing the quality of stormwater that flows through our piped stormwater system and into our creeks, ditches, ponds, and the bay. Now is your opportunity to help others learn that trash, leaves, grass clippings, and chemicals do not belong in the City's storm drains. The water that flows through Safety Harbor's storm drains goes directly into Old Tampa Bay, sometimes without prolonged treatment. This messaging is essential to prevent illicit discharges of waste in storm drains and pivotal to maintaining safe, clean oceans and beaches.



To encourage residents, volunteers, and students to get involved; the City of Safety Harbor will provide the needed supplies free to participating groups. Materials the City of Safety Harbor will provide: safety vests, traffic cones, up to two pre-made stencils (if requested), a wire brush, traffic rated paint (red, black, blue, white, and yellow), paint brushes, sidewalk chalk for outlining mural, rubber gloves, tarps to protect the pavement from paint, additional mixing containers, a bucket for soaking brushes, paint rollers, paint rolling trays, sealant, and painters tape. Some materials will be required to be returned to the City following mural completion. Materials participants will provide include water for soaking brushes, trash bags, paper towels, and towels to kneel on while painting if desired. Libraries play an important role in communities. New residents move to Safety Harbor for our beautiful parks, Main Street events, variety of restaurants and shops, and unique neighborhoods. Many locate here because of the strength of our downtown library. You probably already know about the digital resources, books, tools, museum passes, other collections, and events the library offers, but another important, immeasurable value is community connection.

We see parents attending Story Time, then staying so their children can play with the toys in the Imaginative Play area and checking out as many books as they can carry. We see caregivers reading to children in comfy chairs and young mothers lingering after Story Time talking, creating friendships. We see children grow up and years later as tweens and teens, visit after school to hang out with friends. Some get their homework done, others talk to friends or play video or board games. Many become teen volunteers, gaining pre-work experience and creating meaningful relationships with our teen librarians.

We see older adults, our regulars, come in to pick up books or use the public computers due to lack of internet or a home printer. We listen to their stories about their weekend or family far away, providing a listening ear. We help our seniors with one-on-one computer training, giving them the confidence needed to use their iPad or new e-Reader. We've seen people learn to play the ukulele here and now teach it joyfully to others. We know what our homebound patrons like to read, listen to, and watch.

We are here when a frantic student needs a test proctored, and we celebrate when one of our students graduates from Career Online High School. We've seen ESOL students become citizens and members of our book groups become friends. We've seen residents create business plans and become successful small business owners. We provide meeting space for groups to gather. We've helped people research and write their personal history.

Librarians are in a unique position to identify the needs of residents of a small community and work hard to meet them. We create community connections. Our value is not quantifiable, but not less important.
