CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

MARINA CHANNEL DREDGING

On May 15, 2023, City Commission approved a contract with Gator Dredging to perform channel dredging at the City Marina. The dredging limits took place from Channel Markers 3 and 4 to Channel Markers 9 and 10. Dredging operations will continue through the end of August requiring the boat ramp to remain closed to the public for safety.

PICKLEBALL COURTS AT MARSHALL STREET PARK

On July 17, 2023, City Commission approved a Contract with Khors Construction to install five pickleball courts and a practice half-court behind the existing tennis courts at Marshall Street Park. The existing racquetball courts will be removed to make room for the new pickleball courts. Construction will commence in

September. Work hours are limited to weekdays from 7:00AM to 6:00PM. No work will occur between the hours of 6:00PM and 7:00AM on any day, or at any time on Sunday (per City of Safety Harbor's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 15, Section 15.03).

RESURFACING & MISCELLANEOUS ROAD WORK

The City issued an invitation for bid for milling and resurfacing of several City roadways and City park facilities, along with sidewalk and curb modifications. Streets included will be within the Bayfront Manor, Highway to Bay, Baywoods, Rainbow Farms, Harbor Woods Village, Northwood East, Philippe Woods, Philippe Bay, Bayshore Terrace, Washington Brennan, Spring Park, Safety Harbor Industrial Park, West and South Green Springs, Seminole Park, Fernbrooke, and Harbor Oaks Subdivisions.

Construction will follow upon project award by City Commission. Work hours are limited to weekdays from 7:00AM to 6:00PM. No work will occur between the hours of 6:00PM and 7:00AM on any day, or at any time on Sunday (per City of Safety Harbor's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 15, Section 15.03).

GRANT APPLICATIONS & MAYOR'S AWARD OF EXCELLENCE NOMINATIONS

FIRE SAFETY: BACK TO SCHOOL EDITION *by: Andrew Portale, Firefighter/Paramedic*



Attention to all college students beginning the new academic term this fall! By now, you've aced your standardized tests, knocked out a few AP courses, and satisfied many pre-requisite courses, but when is the last time you sat through fire safety training? Your empty-nester parents or caregiver(s) walked alongside you this far, but this next chapter involves making your own smart life choices, especially living in dorms and off-campus.

Available data points to several common causes of fires in collegiate settings, including cooking, smoking, candles, and overloaded power strips. You can help prevent structure fires by staying present while cooking, keeping a tidy work area, and only using authorized kitchen areas. See your Resident Advisor or landlord for more details.

Another leading cause of fire problems is cigarettes, especially when left unattended. Always be sure to extinguish cigarettes and avoid throwing them in a trash receptacle. Avoid smoking on living room furniture and especially in bed. Smoking while intoxicated or tired can quickly lead to structure fires. Lastly, unattended candles are fire hazards, especially when placed near combustible items or in unstable holders.

You can ace this school year by remaining cognizant of the hazards mentioned above and incorporating basic fire prevention measures. Take stock of fire alarm and sprinkler systems, fire extinguishers, and smoke detectors. And remember, immediately notify Fire and EMS when an emergency arises.

DID YOU KNOW? YELLOW CURBS *by: Renee Cooper, Public Works Director*

Have you visited downtown lately? Have you seen the freshly painted yellow curbs? Public Works began painting curbs earlier this year in the downtown area in an effort to keep the intersections clear for safe pedestrian access, enhanced driver visibility, and allowing access for emergency vehicles.

As per Florida Statutes 316.1945 and the City's Code of Ordinances Section 23.10(c)(6), it is unlawful to park within 20 feet of a crosswalk or intersection, except where approved designated parking spaces are located; 23.10(c)(7) it is unlawful to park within 30 feet of any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of the street; 23.10(c)(4) it is unlawful to park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant; 23.10(c)(8) it is unlawful to park within 20 feet of a fire station entrance (same side of road) and within 75 feet of the fire station entrance (opposite side of road).

The yellow curb markings assist drivers by indicating an area of no parking in accordance with City Ordinance and State Law. However, drivers shall still observe areas of no parking near intersections, crosswalks, hydrants, fire stations, etc., even if the curbs are not painted and wherever signs are posted. Through these efforts and continued monitoring, City staff will continue to work to improve parking conditions downtown.



September is Library Card Sign-up Month, a time when libraries nationwide work together to ensure every child signs up for a library card and to remind communities about valuable resources available at your library.





RISEUP TEENS! BEFORE & AFTER MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

School is back in session, and Safety Harbor Recreation has a new Before and After School Program for Safety Harbor Middle School students - RiseUpTeens! RiseUp will be based out of the Safety Harbor Museum and Cultural Center, Monday through Friday beginning at 7:00AM with after care until 6:00PM. Teens can come to before care for \$175 per month, after care for \$150 per month, or before and after care for \$300 per month. Drop off and pick up is at the Museum, and transportation to and from Safety Harbor Middle School is provided as part of the program.

RiseUp Teens offers middle school students a unique before and after care opportunity that goes beyond supervised care. Teens in the program will get to develop healthy social skills, learn life and job skills, and just kick back and have fun with a variety of opportunities. Students will begin their day with arts & crafts, video games, homework, and more. Some days, they'll venture out into Downtown visiting restaurants for a bite to eat or spending the morning at the park before heading off to school. After school, children can visit the library, recreation centers, or stroll to the Safety Harbor pier to watch the manatees.

What Items WILL be collected?

- Toilets
- Boxsprings & mattresses
- Scrap metal: pile separately
- Old appliances, including: washers, dryers, stoves, hot water heaters, microwaves, dishwashers
- Other items must be bundled, bagged, or boxed – under 50 lbs
- Lawn/yard equipment: drained of oil & gas

* Collection occurs only once during the Clean-up cycle, so it is important to place items at the curb by 6:30AM on your regular collection day.

If you miss the clean-up day, special pick-ups may be requested, for a fee, by calling Public Works.
