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STORM RECOVERY UPDATES

CITY PARKS *by: Robert Moser, Parks & Building Maintenance Superintendent*



Parks and Building Maintenance Staff have continued to work on restoring parks and their amenities following the 2024 storms. Numerous fences have been replaced or repaired, with still more coming throughout the Spring. Tree evaluations and hazardous removals continue to be a priority, as well as large replacement projects for damaged assets. Notable replacement projects include the Marshall Street playground swing set, which has been ordered and is scheduled for delivery and installation in late April or early May. The shade structure at Waterfront Park has a brand-new set of shade sails in production, with a target for installation occurring in March. Other projects that have been completed or are nearing completion at the time of writing include Daisy Douglas Park playground repair, Marina Park decorative fountain repair, Safety Harbor City Park backstop padding and windscreens replacements, various roof repairs on citywide facilities, and tree replacements at Waterfront and Marina Parks.

FIRE MARSHAL DICK BROCK MEMORIAL PIER *by: Renee Cooper, Public Works Director*

The 2024 Hurricane Season resulted in significant damages to Pinellas County. Unfortunately, the Fire Marshal Dick Brock Memorial Pier suffered catastrophic damage. The City had already been in design since August 2022 and completed permitting in June 2024 for the pier's replacement. The damage sustained during the storms pushed the City to rewrite portions of the completed bid documents. The project will not be bid for construction until staff verify the amount and completion of waterway debris removal.

Following Hurricane Helene, the City contacted multiple private demolition contractors to provide budgetary pricing for removal of waterway debris and remaining pilings. Simultaneously, the City also contacted the State of Florida for assistance. Under the direction of Governor Ron DeSantis, the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM)'s mission is to work collaboratively with state and local agencies to remove waterway debris ensuring the safety and navigability of Florida's waterways. Waterway debris is seen as an environmental hazard that must be removed to restore and maintain healthy aquatic ecosystems, as well as a safety hazard to boaters and kayakers, and has an economic impact through loss of use for visitors and a detriment to fishing through destruction of habitat. As of the writing of this article the City is finalizing plans for the State to remove all debris.

The City is committed to the swift removal of waterway debris followed by the timely issuance of a Request for Proposal for the pier replacement. Check the City's social media accounts as well as the City website for updates.

CITY OF SAFETY HARBOR CREEKS COMPREHENSIVE PLAN *by: Michelle Giuliani, Engineering Director*

On January 21, 2025, City staff provided the City Commissioners information on the management and maintenance of public sections of Bishop Creek and Mullet Creek and legal options for the management and maintenance of private sections of the creeks. The City's Consultant, Kimley-Horn, presented project work scopes constructed by the US Army Corps of Engineers study provided to the City in 2023. The City Commissioners provided further direction for the need of a Comprehensive Plan for all creeks within the City of Safety Harbor.

An evaluation of creek bank erosion will continue as a Comprehensive Plan is developed. Note that City staff will continue to receive permit applications for private property repairs to creek bank damage that occurred during Hurricane Debbie, Hurricane Helene, and Hurricane Milton for private property work on Bishop Creek and Mullet Creek.

MAIN STREET ENTRYWAY TREE REPLACEMENT *by: James Ryan, City Arborist*

The EAR tree at Main Street and McMullen Booth Road stood for many years as beloved entry feature to the city. Damaged by Hurricane Helene, the tree was removed in October 2024 and a commitment made to plant a significant tree in its place. Safety Harbor's Tree Committee is happy to announce the feature tree has been selected. Our Community Development Department will oversee the planting of a field grown Gumbo Limbo Tree (*Bursera simaruba*). In addition to the featured Gumbo Limbo, plans also include the planting of two Southern Magnolias (*Magnolia grandiflora*), and two ornamental Weeping Bottle Brush Trees (*Melaleuca viminalis*).

Gumbo Limbos are native, semi-evergreen shade trees often referred to as the "tourist tree" due to the red peeling bark, reminiscent of a sun burnt tourist. Together with the flowering trees, these plantings will create a colorful and memorable display.

More details will be forthcoming about the schedule and community celebration of the restoration of the Main Street entryway.

WELCOME SPRING & THE LIBRARY'S SECOND STORY

If you've been downtown lately, you've noticed the facelift on the library's original building with the addition of a new aluminum, copper colored roof, a fresh coat of paint, and new coordinating awnings. The big change is the near completion of the second story, adding approximately 4,800 square-foot to the facility.

During construction, the Children's Wing was closed for safety reasons due to work happening above. Part of the youth collection was placed in storage and part moved to other locations within the library. We are excited to announce the reopening of the wing in late March with some

additions coming soon, including a Reading Nook Tree and adjacent mural, comfortable new seating, relocation of the computer stations, two new educational computers, and upgraded toys for the Imaginative Play Area. A glass storefront door, funded by the Friends of the Library and Library Foundation, will be installed to insulate the wing from the rest of the library and the small Story Time room repurposed primarily for tween programming. Staff is excited to welcome you back to the Children's Wing and bring programs back on site after being hosted at other locations.

The second story will be open to the public soon. Upstairs will house an 1,800 square-foot meeting room for library programs, non-profit use, and public rentals. The meeting room on the first floor will also reopen for the same. The Deaf Literacy Center will relocate to the second floor, opening space on the first floor for staff and library programming. Upstairs will also house a quiet, public workspace on first come, first serve basis for study and remote workers.

Every year in April, libraries across the United States celebrate National Library Week, a time to recognize the vital role libraries play in fostering learning, literacy, connection, and opportunity in our communities. With our new space and upgrades, staff is eager to bring programs for all ages, back in-house. We are planning our first musical program for adults during National Library Week, (April 6-12), to showcase our new space.
