HURRICANE SEASON, RAINY SEASON – EVERY SEASON IS FLOOD SEASON!

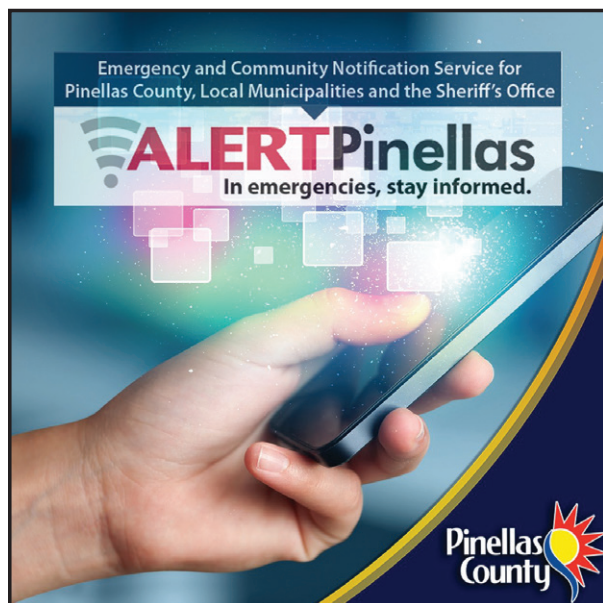
Why do we need flood insurance? Flooding can happen anywhere at any time. In fact, more than 20% of the National Flood Insurance Program's claims come from outside of high-risk flood zones. It is important to protect your property and possessions with flood insurance even if you live in an area with low-to-moderate flooding risk. Anywhere it rains, it can flood.

A few inches of water can cause thousands of dollars in damage to walls, floors, furniture, carpets, and appliances. This damage resulting from rising waters is not typically covered by homeowner or renter insurance policies. Fortunately, flood insurance for buildings and the contents is available to property owners and renters.

The cost of a policy depends on your flood risk. The City of Safety Harbor works diligently to maintain a discount on flood insurance premiums for residents and businesses in all flood zones. Look for the discount on your flood insurance policy invoice.



I encourage you to consider flood insurance for your property as you prepare for future contingencies. To find out more about flood insurance for your property, contact your insurance agent or visit pinellascounty.org/flooding/advocates.htm to learn about Pinellas County's flood insurance advocates that provide a step-by-step process to purchasing flood insurance. HURRICANE, STORM & FLOOD WARNING

Be aware, prepared, and know what you are going to do:

Listen to your local radio and TV during foul weather for weather warnings and possible instructions. Go to pinellascounty.org/emergency or go to weather.gov for real-time weather alerts.

Be prepared to evacuate. HAVE A PLAN! Know how and what to secure if a hurricane threatens.

Sign up for the ALERT PINELLAS, a free emergency notification service. This service provides multiple ways to notify you, such as landlines, mobile phones, email and text messages, whenever an urgent situation, such as flooding, arises in your location. Your contact information will be confidential.

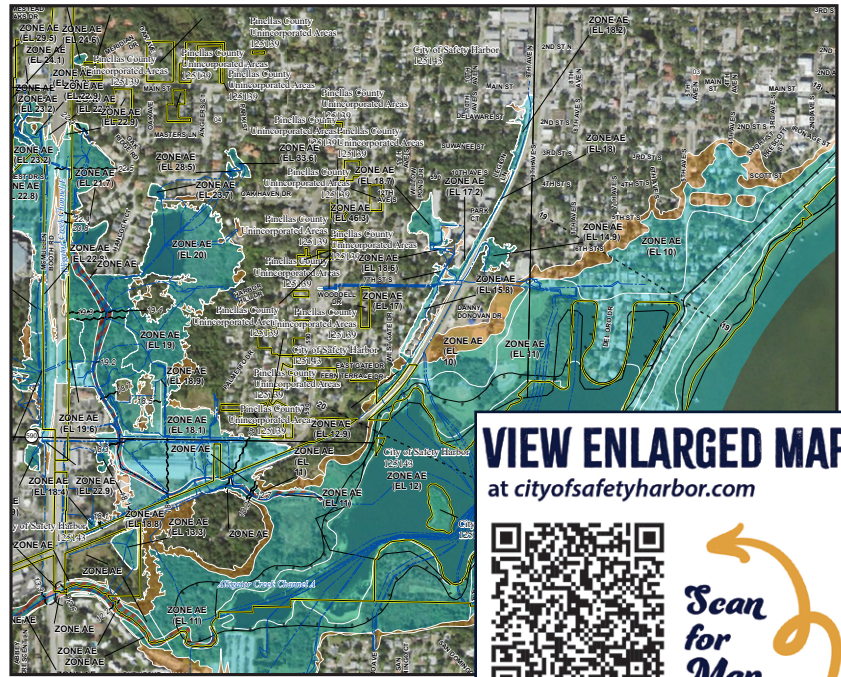
AROUND SAFETY HARBOR

NEW FLOOD MAPS FOR ALLIGATOR CREEK WATERSHED

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has conducted a new Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for the Alligator Creek Watershed. A portion of the watershed included in the study is in Safety Harbor. To determine a community's risk to flood hazards, FEMA performs the FIS, which is a compilation and presentation of flood hazard areas along rivers, streams, coasts, and lakes within a community. The results of the FIS are shown on FEMA's flood maps called Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs), and in the accompanying description of the study called an FIS report.

FEMA has asked that the public be made aware of the updates to the flood hazard areas based upon the FIS study for the Alligator Creek Watershed. The results are expected to be finalized later this year and may result in some changes to the flood zone designations for individual properties. The map shows the preliminary results for the Safety Harbor portion of the watershed. The full FIS and preliminary FIRM maps can be found on FEMA's website: hazards.fema.gov/femaportal/prelimdownload.



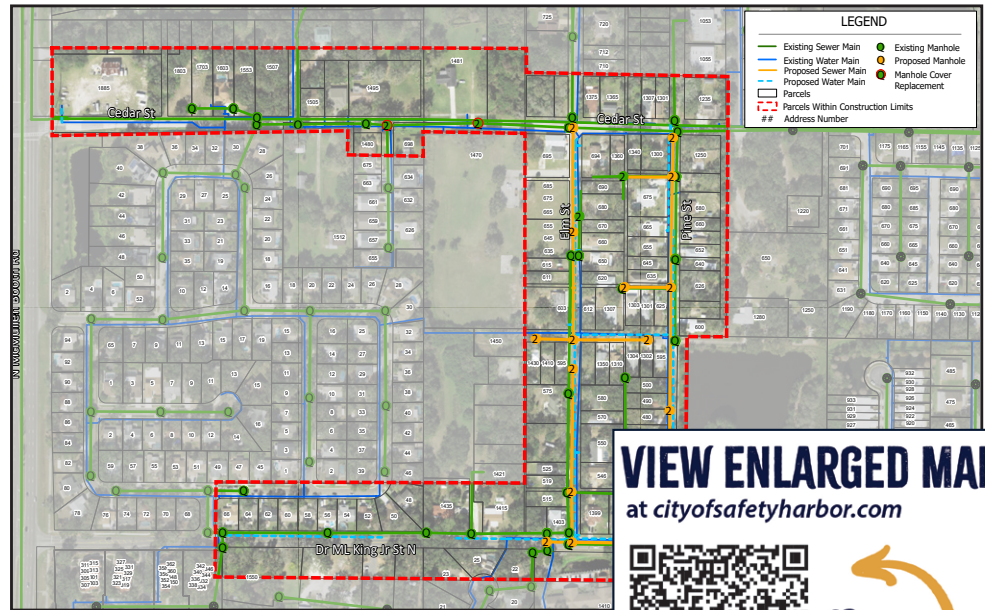
WATER & SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT

On April 7, 2025, the City Commission approved a construction contract for replacement of the City's water and sewer infrastructure within Elm Street, Pine Street, Spruce Street, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Street North, and Cedar Street. The contractor, Left Coast Utilities, has mobilized and started work. Residents will see intermittent lane closures as well as some complete road closures within the project area.

Residents should refrain from parking within the City's rights-of-way during this work as contractors will need full right-of-way access for installation of new utilities. Expected project duration is 18 months. Water and sewer service interruptions will be minimal and occur when the contractor completes final service line and lateral connections on the new water and sewer mains. Advanced notice will be provided to any affected residents.

- 1. Stream and download with hoopla and Kanopy** *hoopla* is free with your library card and provides free access to audiobooks, eBooks, comics, and more. Download the *hoopla* app on your device. Looking for a new movie, documentary, or indie film? Try *Kanopy*.
- 2. Libby – Digital Content Libby** is your resource for digital eBooks, eMagazines, audiobooks, and streaming video on your favorite device. Perfect to take with you on your summer vacation!
- 3. Free Museum Passes** Planning a staycation? Thanks to partnerships with thirteen local museums, the library offers free family admissions. Passes are available on a first come, first serve basis.
- 4. Borrow Things** The library has games to check out for family game nights, pickleball racquets, and ukuleles so you can learn to play. We have WIFI hot spots, themed Reading Adventure Backpacks, STEAM kits for kids, and cake pans to check out.

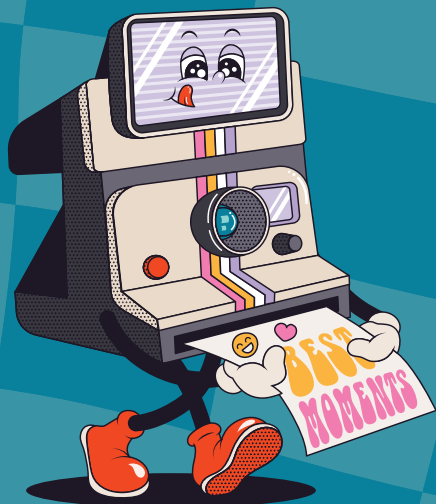

PIER & MARINA CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Post 2024 hurricane season restoration continues. Demolition and Construction at the Marina and Pier is scheduled to begin in July, with an 18 month construction contract time. Construction fencing and barricades will be placed around the construction zone on Veterans Memorial Lane.
