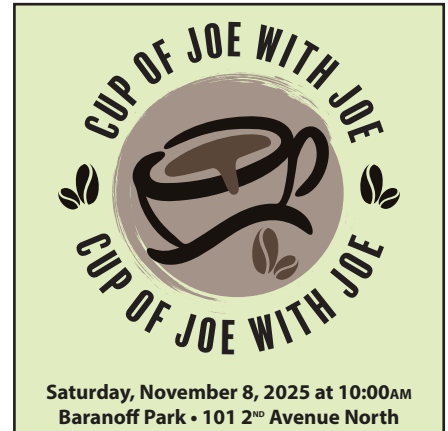

WHO DO YOU CALL FOR CITY MAINTENANCE?

Ever spotted a cracked sidewalk, a pesky pothole, or a low-hanging tree limb and wondered who to contact? The City's Public Works Department is here to help with a wide range of right-of-way and park-related issues, including:

- Sidewalk repairs within City rights-of-way
- Potholes on City streets
- Water leaks from the road to the meter (South of SR-580)
- Sanitary sewer back-ups
- Low-hanging limbs over roadways and sidewalks
- City garbage, recycling, and special pick-ups
- Stormwater drainage concerns
- Street sign maintenance
- Any work occurring within City rights-of-way
- Maintenance issues within City parks

PROTECTING YOUR HOME AGAINST FLOODING

The 2025 hurricane season is almost over, but that doesn't mean you should forget about getting and staying prepared for flooding. Plus, flooding doesn't only happen from hurricanes, and it's easier to prepare for flooding when the weather is nice.

Here are some steps you can take now to protect property from hurricanes and flooding:

- Install storm shutters and reinforced garage doors.
- Retrofit to protect the building, elevate outdoor AC units or install hurricane resistant features like garage doors.
- Note that some flood protection measures may need a building permit and others may not be safe for your type of building. Please contact the Community Development Department at (727) 724-1555 before doing any retrofitting, making alterations or starting repairs. Report unpermitted work to Code Enforcement by calling (727) 724-1555.
- The City of Safety Harbor Engineering Department can offer advice about drainage and nuisance flooding problems on your property. Call (727) 724-1555 for advice about appropriate flood protection. A representative can give advice over the phone or visit the site in question and review the problem with the resident.
- Have adequate insurance in advance. Remember, homeowners insurance policies do not cover flood loss, and there is a 30-day waiting period before flood insurance coverage goes into effect.

Taking these steps before next hurricane season will have you prepared and ahead of the curve.

The library has so much to offer including access to technology, creative programs for all ages, and innovative services like the Tool library. With all these services and so much more, I am excited to be a part of the next chapter of the library.

I'm truly honored to be here and can't wait to meet more of you. Stepping into this role, I'm eager to listen and learn, your thoughts truly help shape the future of our library.

FAREWELL FROM LISA KOTHE

Serving the Safety Harbor community and library patrons from across the county has been a privilege and honor for the past 17 years. As I step away, I am proud of what our dedicated staff has accomplished. I thank them for supporting my sometimes out of the box projects and programs, the Tool Library being one of them. In 2016, when I asked Mallory our Adult Services Manager about this idea, she said, "Yes, that's great. We need to do this," and we created one of our most popular programs, with over 250 tools checked out monthly.

Our library has transformed into a vibrant hub, not only providing popular books and media, but a place for community and connection. During my tenure, some highlights include installing 14 Little Free Libraries, graduating 23 students from Career Online High, and adding a StoryWalk in the Art Park. We have two vibrant adult book clubs, implemented Home Delivery and a Seed Library, a Book Bike, named Bookin' Betty, courtesy of the Friends of the Library, and secured a grant for a local history Walking Tour. We've added murals inside and outside the library, have a new Reading Nook Tree in the Children's Wing, and yes, we even added a second floor! Our welcoming physical spaces ensure every member of our community feels at home when they walk through our doors. Our programs for all ages are models for other libraries. We have accomplished so much and will continue to thrive and serve under new leadership and our devoted staff.

I am proud of my partnerships with the Friends of the Library and the Library Foundation supporting fundraisers from serving beverages at 4th of July, to Book Sales, Art on Canvas, ChairITY and Flamingo fundraisers, Key Lime Pie and Cupcake Contests, Author Talks, Blues on the Bay, mystery dinner theaters, and countless other events to ensure additional funds were available for programs via the Friends and secured for the second floor addition. The friendships and collaborations developed along the way have been a highlight of my career.

I want to thank you, our very special patrons, volunteers, supporters, and our city commission for your belief in the importance of public libraries. You are the force behind all that we've achieved. As I step away, I have the utmost confidence in the talented and innovative staff who will continue to drive our library into its 88th year and beyond.

While I am stepping down from my official role, I will never be far from the library. I look forward to joining the community as a patron, neighbor, and advocate of this wonderful institution. I will carry the memories and relationships with me always. Thank you for allowing the privilege of serving you. I am proud to say I Live, Worked, and will continue to Play in our great little city.

Christmas

Christmas Day falls on Thursday, December 25, 2025. Monday's, Tuesday's, and Wednesday's sanitation collection will occur as regularly scheduled. Thursday's recycling collection will be pushed back to Friday, December 26, 2025. Friday's recycling collection will occur as scheduled.

New Year's Day

New Year's Day falls on Thursday, January 1, 2026. Monday's, Tuesday's, and Wednesday's sanitation collection will occur as regularly scheduled. Thursday's recycling collection will be pushed back to Friday, January 2, 2026. Friday's recycling collection will occur as scheduled.

Christmas Tree Pickup

Christmas Trees should be put out with yard waste on normal garbage day – January 12, 13, or 14.
